

Branches in Winter



their growth patterns, scars, color etc.

Get out your magnifying glass:

Here are some things to look for (courtesy of Dick Rauh whose twigs these are.)

- Delícacy or coarseness
- The look of the terminal bud and scales.
- Position of the lateral buds (alternate or opposite?)
- Shape and pattern of the bundle scars.
- Look for an irregular series of lines that circle the twig, marking a year's growth.
- When adding color, refer back to our mixes for subtle browns and grays- try complements or adding color to browns.
