
Drawing Round Things Value and Form Adding Color






Paul Cezanne

Start by drawing a sphere- one of our perfect circles.

- * Shade in value in graphite first, then in color.
- Keep back on the pencil.
- * Keep your hand light and tone from dark to light.
- * Choose colors that will match your subject. Find a shadow color



- * Start with your lightest color is you feel the need to underpaint and sandwich in your shadow color after.
- * Now try getting more painterly like Cezanne. Do another sphere using his colors.
