Kneaded eraser. Also recommended -the Tombow Mono Round eraser for graphite drawing.

Colored Pencils:

Feel free to use the pencils you already have Good **quality** colored pencils (Prismacolors, Lyra Rembrandt, Faber-Castell, Caran d'Ache Pablos or Luminance) are best. (Crayona or Prang are hard and will not give you good color.) I recommend buying any pencils **individually**. Faber-Castell has an inexpensive student line called Goldfaber with the same color # as below. This is a good limited palette list. **Buy what you can get and afford**.

If you already own watercolor pencils bring them along.
