
Back to Basics Using the Color Wheel/Blending Colors

Start the year off revisiting the color wheel and working with a limited palette of yellow, red, and blue.

- Create a small circle with your, your yellow that leans orange (107), your red that leans purple (126), and your blue that leans green (110).
- Do another circle with the yellow that leans green, (205), the red that leans orange (121) and the blue that leans purple (120).
- Mix two of your colors to create a secondary color
- Add the complement and create a brown.

Take your time mixing and blending.
